

What is SROP?

The Summer Research Opportunities
Program (SROP) is a gateway to graduate
education at Big Ten Academic Alliance
universities. The goal of the program is to
increase the number of underrepresented
students who pursue graduate study and
research careers. SROP helps prepare
undergraduates for graduate study through
intensive research experiences with faculty
mentors and enrichment activities.

This is also an opportunity for
Michigan State University faculty to evaluate
you as a potential graduate student.



Program Goals

- 1. Prepare students for career next steps
- 2. Provide a mentoring experience for undergraduate students with an MSU faculty
- Prepare students for the graduate school application process
- 4. Prepare students for the rigor they will experience during graduate school
- 5. Recruit undergraduate students for graduate study at MSU

Program Eligibility

- U.S. citizen or permanent resident
- Enrolled in a degree-granting program at a college/university in the U.S.
- Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Have completed at least 2 semesters of undergraduate education
- Have at least 1 semester of undergraduate education remaining after completing MSU SROP
- Demonstrate a strong interest in graduate study (Masters or Ph.D.)
